Crime remains a concern but we are not seeing any major spikes in crime related incidents. Admittedly whilst not on the increase, crime in our sector remains at stubbornly high levels.

Three crimes a try and track are burglaries, house robberies and hijackings. These are stable but we need to do a lot more to bring them down. We experience at least one burglary a day in the sector.

Crime for May as follows:

Theft out of motor vehicles – up

Theft of MV – down

Burglary – up

Business burglary – down

Robbery – down

House robbery – up

Hijacking – down

Crime remains real. Only by getting involved in your area can one start to make a difference. The police cannot do it on their own and many security companies are re-active.
